Blessing of a Crib scene at home



This simple blessing of the Christmas Crib is for use in the home, prayed by the family/household members and visitors over the Crib. Suggested use Christmas Eve or Christmas Day, before opening the gifts.

Gather everyone along with visitors and neighbours around your crib scene as you begin. You may like to light a candle or tealight as you begin/

MARY'S MAGNIFICAT

One of the household recites the antiphon, and then the Magnificat, alternating verses with the rest of the household.

Antiphon: The Lord has regarded humble persons and places, therefore all generations shall call them blessed.

My soul magnifies the Lord,
and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour:

Because he has regarded the lowliness of his handmaid;
for behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed;

Because he who is mighty has done great things for me,
and holy is his name:

And his mercy is from generation to generation,
on those who fear him.

He has shown might with his arm,
he has scattered the proud in the conceit of their heart.

He has put down the mighty from their thrones,
and has exalted the lowly.

He has filled the hungry with good things,
and the rich he has sent away empty.

He has given help to Israel, his servant,
mindful of his mercy.

Even as he spoke to our fathers
to Abraham and to his posterity forever.

**Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
as it was in the beginning, is now, and shall be for ever.
Amen**

Antiphon: The Lord has regarded humble persons and places, therefore all generations shall call them blessed.

FIRST READING *Someone reads....:*

The eternal Son of God having become human out of love for us, chose to be born in a lowly stable, rather than in the greatest palace of kings. Being rich, He became poor for our sake to show us how greatly He loves poverty and humility. But the presence of the King of kings made this lowly shelter to be the most honourable and noble of royal palaces. Here He was pleased to be, adored by His mother and father, by the poor shepherds, and by the wealthy magi. As a human being among us Christ came for all people, of all times, and all places; unless we say "there is no room," He will come into our home this Christmas night, and will make it a place of splendour, of love and of great joy.

All: Thanks be to God.

Reader: The Word was made flesh, Alleluia.

All: And dwells among us, Alleluia.

SECOND READING *Someone else reads:*

From the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke:

At that time the shepherds were saying to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this event that has come to pass which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste, and found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in the manger. And when they had seen, they understood what had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard marvelled at the things told them by the shepherds. But Mary kept in mind all these words pondering them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, even as it was spoken to them.

Each member of the family kisses the Gospel text and it may be laid by the crib scene

PRAYER

Leader: O Lord, hear my prayer.

All: **And let my cry come unto Thee.**

Leader: The Lord be with you.

All: **And with you also.**

Leader: O God, out of your love for us you sent your dearly beloved Son to become human. You willed that he be born in a humble stable in order to give us an example of humility. We pray you now to bless this crib, a representation of the scene of his birth; may it draw us closer to him. By imitating his humility may we become a worthy dwelling place for his rebirth, Jesus Christ, thy Son our Lord.

All: **Amen.**

All may sing or listen to, "O Come All Ye Faithful" or "Silent Night."
