

Eucharist - When the bells ring please stand as you are able and join in singing

Opening hymn - 758

Ye watchers and ye holy ones, bright seraphs, cherubim, and thrones, raise the glad strain, Alleluia! Cry out, dominions, princedoms, powers, virtues, archangels, angels' choirs:

Refrain: Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

O higher than the cherubim, more glorious than the seraphim, lead their praises, Alleluia! O Mary, bearer of the Word, most gracious, magnify the Lord: [Refrain]

Respond, ye souls in endless rest, ye patriarchs and prophets blest, Alleluia! Alleluia! Ye holy twelve, ye martyrs strong, all saints triumphant, raise the song: [Refrain]

O friends, in gladness let us sing, supernal anthems echoing, Alleluia! Alleluia! To God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit, Three in One: [Refrain Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

Collect for Purity

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Prayers of Penitence

God is love and we are God's children.
There is no room for fear in love.
We love because God loved us first.
Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith.

Sit/kneel

God our Father, we confess to you and to our fellow members in the Body of Christ that we have sinned in thought, word and deed, and in what we have failed to do. We are truly sorry. Forgive us our sins, and deliver us from the power of evil, for the sake of your Son who died for us, Jesus Christ, our Lord.

God, who is both power and love, + forgive you and free you from your sins, heal and strengthen you by the Holy Spirit, and raise you to new life in Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading - Romans 8.12–17

A reading from the letter of Paul to the Romans.

12 Brothers and sisters,
we are debtors, not to the flesh,
to live according to the flesh —

13 for if you live according to the flesh, you will die;
but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body,
you will live.

14 For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God.

15 For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!'

16 it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, 17 and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ – if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

Gospel – John 3.1–17- standing as you are able

Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John **Glory to Christ our Saviour.**

- 1 There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews.
- 2 He came to Jesus by night and said to him,
- 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.'
- 3 Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' 4 Nicodemus said to him,
- 'How can anyone be born after having grown old?

Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?'

5 Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you,

no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit.

- 6 What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit.
- 7 Do not be astonished that I said to you,
- "You must be born from above."
- 8 The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes.

So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.'

- 9 Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?'
- 10 Jesus answered him,
- 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?
- 11 Very truly, I tell you,

we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony.

- 12 If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things?
- 13 No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man.
- 14 And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up,

15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

16 For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

17 Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.'

The Rite of Confirmation

Introduction

Blessed be God,

the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

by whose great mercy we have been born anew to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

Presentation of the Candidates

Ailidh, Oscar, Patricia, Phoebe have come to make a deeper commitment to our Lord Jesus Christ by making their baptismal promises. We pray for Ailidh, Oscar, Patricia, Phoebe and for ourselves.

Prayer

Eternal God,

who at the baptism of Jesus revealed him to be your Son, anointing him with the Holy Spirit:

keep your people, born of water and the Spirit, faithful to their calling; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**.

Turning to Christ - the Bishop addresses Ailidh, Oscar, Patricia & Phoebe

Ailidh, Oscar, Patricia & Phoebe the Christian life means turning from evil and turning to Christ.

Do you renounce evil? I renounce evil.

Do you repent of sin? I repent of sin.

Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Will you follow Christ?

I will follow Christ.

PROFESSION OF FAITH - the Bishop addresses everyone

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.
We believe in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Congregation sit

COMMITMENT TO CHRISTIAN LIFE — to the candidates

Ailidh, Oscar, Patricia & Phoebe will you continue in the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread and in the prayers? *With the help of God, I will.*

Will you proclaim the good news by word and deed, serving Christ in all people?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you work for justice and peace, honouring God in all Creation? With the help of God, I will.

The Bishop addresses the whole congregation

This is the task of the Church.

This is our task:

to live and work for the kingdom of God.

THE LAYING ON OF HANDS - The Bishop says

God of mercy and love, new birth by water and the Spirit is your gift, a gift none can take away; grant that your servants may grow into the fullness of the stature of Christ. Fill them with the joy of your presence. Increase in them the fruit of your Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of love, patience and gentleness, the spirit of wonder and true holiness.

The Bishop lays hands on each candidate in silence, and then says

Come, Creator Spirit, rekindle in Ailidh/Oscar/Patricia/Phoebe your gifts of grace, to love and serve as a disciple of Christ.



All Amen.

Renew his/her life in Christ and bring to completion all that your calling has begun.

All **Amen**.

Anointing the candidate with the Oil of Chrism, the bishop says

Empower your disciple, Ailidh/Oscar/Patricia/Phoebe to bring life to the world.
All **Amen**.

At the conclusion of the laying-on of hands for all of the candidates, the president says

Living God, sustain all your people to be hope and strength to the world; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be honour and glory, now and for ever.

All **Amen**.

Ailidh, Oscar, Patricia & Phoebe are presented to the congregation by the Rector, and everyone gives them a round of applause.



Congregation sit/kneel

Glory and thanksgiving be to you, most loving Father, for the gift of your Son born in human flesh.

He is the Word existing beyond time, both source and final purpose, bringing to wholeness all that is made. Obedient to your will he died upon the Cross. By your power you raised him from the dead.

He broke the bonds of evil and set your people free to be his Body in the world. On the night when he was given up to death, knowing that his hour had come, having loved his own, he loved them to the end.

At supper with his disciples he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat.
This is my Body: it is broken for you."



After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying:

"Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."


We now obey your Son's command.

Made one with him, we offer you these gifts

the apostles, and prophets,
and of all our brothers and sisters
living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end.

The Breaking of the Bread

The living bread is broken for the life of the world. **Lord, unite us in this sign.**

After the Agnus Dei the people come forward to the communion rail and stand or kneel to receive communion.

Receiving Communion
